Warehouse Forklift Training Programs Prince George - Warehouses could either be industrial, commercial or retail facilities, functioning from product distribution services to bulk product retailing. Regardless of the type of warehouse, workers inside warehouse settings must be well trained in safety measures related to material storage and handling, loading docks, conveyor systems, and pallet jacks and forklifts. Good housekeeping is important to an orderly and safe warehouse setting.

The loading dock system is often build into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move items moving out and coming in of the warehouse. Workers will also load and unload materials and merchandise from the elevated docks and ramps. Particular attention must be paid to safety practice in this stage. To prevent falls, install yellow striping along the edge of ramps and docks. Pay attention to the area all-around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, specifically the area between truck and dock. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked while unloading.

Some warehouses use conveyor systems to distribute products within the facility. Conveyor systems have moving wheels and belts which pose a pinch point hazard. Keep hair and body parts far away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a danger to staff beneath if safety nets are absent. Personnel have to know how to stop conveyors in case of emergency. Be aware of the location of emergency stop buttons and off switches. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

Forklifts and pallet jacks are designed to move materials around the warehouse. Forklift operators are required to take training and be given certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not require certification, but must be trained about the machine. Training programs instruct operators in the proper methods for hoisting objects and transporting them to their assigned place. Neither pallet jacks nor forklifts must ever be made use of to transport or lift employees.

To allow for adequate room for machines and individuals to pass, rack systems and storage shelving help to create an efficient and orderly work space, particularly if they are correctly braced. Careful and slow placement of good is needed to prevent accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by keeping products flat and in the shelving units. Pallets are made use of for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletized products must be shrink-wrapped or baled, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) should be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' heads, limbs, hands and feet. Hard hats or bump caps, gloves and steel-toed shoes are common PPE.

Slippery floors that are pocked with pits and dents can present significant dangers, making good housekeeping extremely vital. Warehouse floors and docks should be clear of dirt, debris and oil. The area must be kept clear of trash, boxes and baling materials.
