Forklift License Prince George - Obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification in North America would require the trainee to perform classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The federal, state and provincial regulatory bodies are responsible for the licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators. Operators could acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks that come together with various options, such as sit-down and stand-up. There are various sizes and types of forklift suitable for various industrial uses. Operator training programs are normally individualized in order to deal with the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck in a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and equipment. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular course requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training which is offered by the employer is the most common method of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who offers this method of certification is needed to provide classroom sessions and practical training on equipment at their place of work. Employers could choose to train employees on every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation methods, company rules, lift truck maintenance and safety procedures. Topics specific to the worksite, like hazardous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each type of lift truck on the worksite.

When utilizing a third party trainer, the certification process will normally consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training permits the operator to operate a lift truck for that employer only.

The most significant aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one kind of equipment to another. Safety issues vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, such as in offshore and marine operations.
